

Novel Destinations Summer Reading Bingo Card



After completing a square, put an X through the block. You are eligible for a McDonald's free coffee coupon after completing your first square. After completing your second and third squares you are eligible for additional incentive coupons.

To get a "bingo" complete a row in any direction. You are eligible for a Trinity Repertory Coupon (one \$15 ticket to any show in the 2011-2012 season) after your first bingo.

Turn in your card on or before the Summer Reading Awards Program on Thursday, August 5 and be eligible to receive a free (gently used) book.
